are well known in the North American Welsh Community, welcoming into their home a steady stream of visitors from academics to historians to students. They helped develop a Welsh Culture collection at Utica College and are regularly consulted for information about Welsh history in our region.

The couple met at Utica Free Academy where Bob was a tenor soloist in the choir and Jeanne was accompanist, Bob's parents emigrated from Merionethshire in N.Wales in the early 1900's while Jeanne- of Scottish background – was originally from Amsterdam, NY.

They married after Bob completed his military service in WW2. One of his final duties was on a medical ship off the French coast during the D-Day invasion. While raising their five children, Bob worked for the NY Telephone Company and Jeanne gave private music lessons. Today they have seven grandchildren.

Bob's family were very active in gymanfa and eisteddfod events. In 1951, when he won the soloist prize in the Utica Eisteddfod the music adjudicator Dr Griffith J. Jones of Cleveland, Ohio, said: "He has a voice with a tear in it like the late Al Jolson."

Jeanne was similarly involved in music. As well as teaching, she organized recitals for students and performances for veteran artists She was also president of the B Sharp Musical Club of Utica, one of the oldest music societies in NY. In 1976 Bob and Jeanne formed the Saint David's Choir that had about 50 members and performed regionally. Bob was also song leader and Jeanne an accompanist for gymanfa ganu services throughout the state and led similar events for the Utica St David's organization as well as at Remsen, Steuben, and Nelson

The couple were also instrumental in organizing the Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu services held in Utica in 1981 and 1996 and both have served as president for the Utica St David's Society, where Bob was Historian for many years. He is now an Emeritus Executive member of this society and a lifetime trustee of the Remsen-Steuben Historical Society.

While music has been an integral part of Bob and Jeanne's marriage, so also is their long involvement in New Hartford Presbyterian Church. Says Pastor Sue Riggles, "They are just people of high moral standing and their integrity is above reproach. They genuinely like each other and are good friends."

Now 97 and 95, respectively, Bob and Jeanne have cut down on their schedules although Jeanne still plays keyboard at various functions. Utica St David's Society president, Linda Walters, sums it up. "When you think of Welsh heritage and the St David's Society in Central New York, the first names that come up are Robert and Jeanne. To all of us, they mean an awful lot because they were active long before us and through them, we learned so much about Welsh history in this area."
