The induction ceremony of the Rev. Robert Everett (1797—1875) into the Oneida County History Hall of Fame on October 19th, 2023 was well attended by society members.

Everett was a Welsh immigrant, minister and abolitionist who lived in Utica and Oneida County after arriving here in 1823.

WALES or CYMRU? A name change is in the works



A petition calling for Wales to be known only by its Welsh name "Cymru" has recently been launched in Wales and now garnered more than 10,000 signatures, making it an eligible topic for debate in the Senedd (Welsh Parliament).

The petition, on the Senedd's website, says: "Wales is a name imposed on Cymru and essentially not a Welsh word at all, deriving from an Anglo-Saxon word meaning 'foreigner' -(explained by the fact Britian's original inhabitants retreated west from invaders from the east around 500 BC).

In 2022, the Welsh Football Association said it was considering changing the official name of the team from' Wales' to 'Cymru' after the World Cup in Qatar, and already uses 'Cymru' at its headquarters and in communications and documents. (BTW, 'Cymru' is pronounced "Come – ree").
